## Hot autumn of the Carpathians

Significant events, which took place this September in the Carpathians, demonstrated that our project is running just in time.

The Forum Carpaticum (September 16-18, Lviv, Ukraine) is an open meeting of the <u>Science for the Carpathians</u> (S4C) initiative. Including a broad spectrum of scientific disciplines from both, the natural and social sciences, as well as practical knowledge, the Forum Carpaticum is an attempt to integrate different fields of expertise to generate value for the Carpathian mountain region.

COP4, the Fourth Meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Carpathian Convention (September 23-26, Mikulov, Czech Republic) — is revising of what have been done during last 3 years, evaluating and adopting next steps to the Convention implementation.

Both events applied to local communities for practical action for sustainable development in the region. InRuTou project meets their requirements and offers concrete approaches and ways for action. That's why the project was presented widely at both events. It was in a high interest of the participants that means that results of our work will be in use outside of our pilot areas.

COP4 in general stated a new stage of the Carpathian Convention developing when a deep and wise integration is needed for further sustainability. Cooperation between different structures at all levels is a hard task for everyone: we need to integrate environmental issues and environmental friendly lifestyle into policy and everyday life of people. Strategy for Sustainable Tourism Development of the Carpathians (one of the main documents adopted by the Conference of Parties) is unique guidelines how to implement the Convention's requirements into the practice. InRuTou project gives direct and concrete receipts for action. Successful presentation at the Conference on Sustainable Tourism in the Carpathians, which was arranged just before the COP4 and side-event at the COP4 itself demonstrated that our project is able to support and assist sustainable development of the mountain communities in all Carpathian countries.



## Success Factors Leading to Rural Tourism Development

Many communities in rural and mountainous areas are facing challenges and difficulties including – among others – unemployment, depopulation, environmental degradation or social problems. Furthermore, it is often the case that local communities are excluded from emerging developments, especially because they have no adequate access to training opportunities and thus lack specific knowledge and skills.

The project InRuTou aims at facilitating the development of sustainable rural tourism by an innovative training and competence development approach, which provides an innovative set of skills for the participants and helps them to get a better access to the labour market. As the digital field plays an important role in the context of rural tourism, the innovative training approach is supported by ICT tools.

In the frame of the project's background analysis there was conducted a best-practice analysis that attempted to identify examples of successful rural tourism development. It gives an insight into strengths, weaknesses, challenges and opportunities in this context and identifies key success factors.

The analyzed case-studies are initiatives from the Alps, the Apennines and the Carpathians and encompass examples from Italy, Austria, Poland, Romania and Ukraine. Based on interviews with representatives of these initiatives common factors emerged, that are **characteristic for successful rural tourism development**. Among others, these are:

- cross-sectoral partnerships,
- high quality and authentic products or
- up-to-date communication technologies for promoting a destinations' image.

However, there have been identified also several challenges, such as:

- the importance of gaining the local peoples' acceptance and
- administrative support or demographic and infrastructural hurdles that have to be encountered.

The analysis has shown that rural tourism can be an essential motor for economic development, especially in peripheral and rural mountain areas. The InRuTou-project thus aims to contribute to the **training of rural tourism entrepreneurs** in the selected pilot areas of Italy, Austria, Poland, Romania and Ukraine.

## InRuTou Training Programme

#### 1) Train the trainers

Tourism training workshops are designed to provide local leaders from pilot areas with knowledge, skills and attitudes needed for the sustainable development of rural mountain communities.

Local leaders will work with communities to pass on knowledge, skills and attitude and to evaluate the usability of the training programme.

## InRuTou Open Educational Resources



The E-learning platform aims to test the technologyenhanced innovative vocational educational training for rural tourism managers.

The course design is based on a **blended learning** strategy, which is a combination of offline (face-to-

face, traditional learning) and online learning in order to transfer knowledge and skills, increase competencies and facilitate acquisition of practical skills in six distinctive areas - modules:

- Entrepreneurship
- Management
- Information and Communication Technologies
- Engaging Communities
- Marketing
- Ecotourism & Sustainable Development.

The structure of each module comprises of:

- 1) 1st face to face meeting to introduce the module learning objectives and to watch the video with the participants.
- 2) Personal study three practical case studies, which will lead to a series of "rules or principles" and action points. Participants will have the possibility to further explore the topic by reading online resources.
- 3) 2<sup>nd</sup> face to face meeting devoted to generation of the networked ideas and the module wrap up. The results of the group work will be uploaded in the sharing platform - repository of ideas and cases with a series of tools for networking.

## Setting the Framework for Training Curriculum

During the second InRuTou coordination meeting, on 24<sup>th</sup> September 2013, partners discussed the background and context analysis undergoing in the pilot areas and defined expectations for the pedagogical model for local tourism developers.

The meeting started the day before, on 23<sup>rd</sup> September, with a **field visit** to Parco dell'Aveto – the Italian pilot area, which gave the consortium the opportunity to meet representatives of local tourism businesses and other local actors and discuss their expectations regarding the project.

## For the Development of Sustainable Tourism

The InRuTou project partners met on July 17th, 2014 in Vatra Dornei (Romania) to assess the work done until now and plan work to be done during the next months.

On the following day, July 18th, the first **training of trainers** has taken place, involving opinion leaders and trainers from Austria, Italy, Poland, Romania and Ukraine, who were presented with the project's training methodology and training materials and contributed their suggestions to further develop them.

The video documents two very productive working days that were carried out in an atmosphere of open collaboration leading to very good results.
